### History of Copped Hall

The present house was built in 1753 for John Conyers. However, the Copped Hall estate has a history which stretches back to Domesday. There was a large Elizabethan palace close to the existing house, which once entertained Queen Elizabeth I on one of her progresses. It is said that the first performance of "A Midsummer Night's Dream" took place here. The 18th century house was embellished in the 1890s by the Wythes family who extended it and built a very elaborate Italianate garden with terraces, sculpture, temples, etc. In 1917 a fire gutted the house and there followed over 80 years of gradual decay and demolition.

The Copped Hall Trust was established as a charity in 1993 in order to acquire the mansion and its surroundings and permanently protect it under benign ownership.

The interior of the mansion is being painstakingly restored to its mid-18th century form. The stables to the north of the mansion have been sold and restored as leasehold apartments, subject to strict covenants. This enabled the Trust to begin to work towards stabilising and securing the mansion. Epping Forest District Council gave the Trust a grant to restore the Racquets Court and the Essex Heritage Trust gave a grant to restore the cupolas on the stable roof. A private donation and grants from Essex Environment Trust have enabled the interior of the mansion to be partially roofed. Musical and cultural events are now staged within the mansion.

The Walled Garden is one of the largest in Essex. It was acquired by the Copped Hall Trust due to the generosity of the previous owner. Clearance of the undergrowth by Volunteers has created this magnificent area. One of the ruined greenhouses has been restored and a second greenhouse is well on the way to being brought to its former glory. Produce from the garden is on sale to visitors.

The best way of visiting Copped Hall regularly is to become a "Friend of the Copped Hall Trust".


